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ABOUT THE CHICAGO ACADEMY FOR THE ARTS

Established in 1981, The Chicago Academy for the Arts is a nationally recognized, internationally influential independent high school acclaimed for its unique co-curricular program composed of rigorous college-preparatory academics and professional-level arts training. Designated a National School of Distinction by the John F. Kennedy Center, The Chicago Academy for the Arts provides a challenging and stimulating environment in which young scholar-artists master the skills necessary for academic success, critical thought, and creative expression.

MISSION

The Chicago Academy for the Arts transforms emerging artists through a curriculum and culture which connect intellectual curiosity, critical thinking, and creativity to impart the skills to lead and collaborate across diverse communities.

STUDENT BODY

Students are admitted to The Academy each year based on demonstrated ability in both academics and the arts. For the 2018-2019 school year, 50% of applicants were accepted to The Academy.

The 133 students of The Academy form a diverse community: 66% Caucasian, 18% African American/Black, 8% Latino/Hispanic American, 3% Asian American, 3% Multiracial American, and 2% International. Academy students live in Chicago, its suburbs, and beyond: 51% Chicago, 47% suburbs, 2% international. Many students commute over three hours each day to attend The Academy.

Approximately 50% of students receive need-based tuition assistance each year. A total of \$1.2 million was awarded for the 2018-2019 school year.

Ninety-six percent of the students of the Class of 2018 were admitted to universities, colleges, art institutes, or conservatories. The 39 students comprising the class were collectively awarded over \$10 million in college scholarships.

The average academic class size is 15 students.



FACULTY

The Academy's faculty consists of 55 members, including full-time, certified academic teachers and arts instructors, as well as part-time artist-teachers of local, national, and international acclaim. The student-to-faculty ratio is 4:1. Fifty-three percent of Academy teachers hold graduate degrees.



ARTS CURRICULUM

Each student is a member of one of The Academy's six arts departments: Dance, Media Arts, Music, Musical Theatre, Theatre, or Visual Arts. Each department provides core courses that immerse the students in the discipline of the respective department. Faculty members assess students individually in each course each semester. In addition to their regular arts classwork, students participate in numerous productions throughout the school year. The Academy has over 100 productions each year, including concerts, plays, musicals, readings, screenings, and exhibitions. Additionally, The Academy's urban location offers students unparalleled access to, and partnerships with, some of the world's most renowned arts organizations and professionals.

Seniors in each arts department also present major final projects (such as recitals, exhibits, and films) as a graduation requirement.

ACADEMIC CURRICULUM

The Academy's rigorous, collegepreparatory academic program is built upon core studies in English, mathematics, science, social studies, and world languages. Honors courses are offered in selected disciplines. AP courses are offered during a student's junior and senior years.

ACCREDITATION

The Academy is accredited by the Independent Schools Association of the Central States (ISACS) and is a member in good standing of the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS). The Academy is recognized by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) and is a member of the Illinois High School Association (ISHA) and the Arts School Network (ASN).

DAILY SCHEDULE

The Academy's school day begins at 8:30 a.m. and consists of six 45-minute academic periods followed by a three-hour immersion in the student's respective arts discipline.

While the standard school day officially ends at 4:30 p.m., students are required to stay later on the majority of school days for rehearsals, performances, private lessons, or student-led projects. The Academy's extended school day and the significant commutes of many of our students limit their availability for extra-curricular activities.

GRADING POLICY

The Academy provides a cumulative GPA that includes both academic and arts courses as well as a cumulative GPA that includes academic courses only. The Academy does not rank its students.

HONORS AND AP COURSES

Due to AP course availability and scheduling conflicts, students are typically able to take a total of no more than five AP courses. Honors and AP courses are weighted in the GPA.
